General Description:

Provides emergency, pre-hospital care and transportation to the critically injured or ill within the parameters of the license/certification. Complete necessary support functions, such as but not limited it readying the ambulances and maintaining a clean work environment.

Essential Functions:

Stands by in readiness to respond to emergencies during a tour of duty; responds to emergency calls; assesses situation and need for assistance; determines most effective method of emergency treatment; applies treatment to victims(s)/patient(s); advises hospital personnel of situation; transport injured or ill to hospital for treatment.

Maintains records and files; maintains and re-supplies vehicle; identifies needs for additional/replacement supplies and equipment; undertakes continuous training; works with public, medical professionals and others to educate and advise of the role, capabilities and responsibilities of an Emergency Medical Technician; performs other related duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills and Other Characteristics

- Knowledge of applicable State of New Jersey statues, rules, administrative orders, polices and procedures.
- Knowledge of generally accepted EMS policies and procedures
- Knowledge of techniques, requirements and activities associated with emergency medical response.
- Knowledge of record keeping, records and case management.
- Skill in working under stressful situations, in receiving and assessing information, then making appropriate decisions for response.
- Skill in establishing and maintaining good work relations with staff, other departments, law enforcement, and the general public.
- Skill in effectively maintaining equipment, facilities and operations.
- Skill in operating a personal computer utilizing a variety of software applications.
- Skill effectively communicating in both oral and written form.

Physical Requirements:

Work requires good physical fitness with the ability to function effectively in heavy, cumbersome protective gear, be able to lift and carry heavy, bulky items, equipment, materials, supplies and people weighing up to 200 pounds in unpredictable weather conditions over varying terrain. There is also a risk of bodily harm and potential exposure to infectious diseases, toxic fumes and chemicals.
